FOR REFLECTION:

Approximately one quarter of the recorded leaders in the Bible didn't finish well. One of these was **Gideon.** Read his story in Judges 6-8. Gideon is best remembered for how, under God, he was incredibly successful in defeating an enemy of 135,000 with just 300 of his original 32,000 soldiers! However this great leader lost the plot after this remarkable victory. In chapter 8:1-21 we discover he became vindictive and vengeful towards those who had refused to feed his troops. In Chapter 8:22-27, Gideon does the unbelievable – he made idols which led his people away from God, whilst in verses 33-35 we see that by the end of his life, Gideon left virtually no lasting impact for good

- What can we learn from Gideon's disappointing finish?
